Current Major Projects

1. **Division Chair and Committee Member:** SDSU FUERTE (Faculty Unified towards Excellence in Research and Transformational Engagement) is a 5-year initiative funded by the National Institute of Health (NIH) Common Fund designed to increase the scientific workforce diversity and support the research independence of early-stage research faculty who are committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion in biomedical science, especially faculty who are underrepresented in health science research. For the 2022-2023 academic year, three Environmental Health faculty were hired at SDSU Imperial Valley to help launch a Public Health - Environmental Health program in Fall 2023. One additional tenure-track faculty member will be hired in the 2022-2023 academic year. The Public Health minor was launched in Fall 2022.
2. **Project Coordinator:** SDSU Imperial Valley (SDSU-IV) Regional Resilience Lab (r^2 Lab) is designed to serve as the research hub for SDSU-IV, as well as create an academic center for developing research-driven partnerships with community agencies. The lab creates transdisciplinary research opportunities for several r^2 Lab team faculty members from the criminal justice, homeland security, mathematics, and public administration disciplines. Examples of projects underway include research focusing on active shooter incidents, community leadership, economic development performance, public education performance, and teaching mathematics at an Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI). In 2021, the r^2 Lab has secured almost \$14,000.00 in equipment toward a goal of approximately \$62,000.00 to full equip a permanent lab space. The remainder is to be secured during the 2022-2023 academic year.
